Fencing



Founded in 2001, PRCS Fencing Club aims to nurture respectful, responsible, and disciplined young men and women. Supported by a team of dedicated coaches, the training regime at PRCS Fencing Club goes beyond the blade to help our fencers discover what they are gifted at. While the development of skills, agility and coordination are important, PRCS Fencing Club also firmly believes character building will help realise the full potential of all PRCS fencers.

CCA Training and Highlights

Every training session begins with a mass warm-up, followed by intensive mass footwork and hand-drills under the coaches' instruction. Coaches also engage in one-to-one training with our fencers or pit them against one another to further hone their skills.

Expectations of CCA

We expect 100% commitment from every selected fencer who chooses Fencing as their choice CCA. All Sec 1 fencers should be adequately skilled in their assigned weapon and ready for their first competition towards the end of the year. Selection for representation in competitions is carried out by the teachers and coaches. We select students based on their consistency in training, skills, attitude and conduct. All students are expected to possess the drive to achieve in all competitions.

St John Brigade (SJB)



SJB aims to develop its cadets into well-rounded individuals who exhibit traits such as responsibility, empathy, communication skills, and the ability to inspire and guide others. The cadets apply the five key leadership practices from the Leadership Challenge model (developed by James Kouzes and Barry Posner) as they participate in CCA activities to develop and strengthen their leadership competencies.

CCA Training and Highlights

The cadets will learn life-saving skills such as first aid knowledge and the practical use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) to render assistance and help save lives as they will be the first in line to do so at home, in school and the community. The cadets have opportunities to attend first aid certification courses **which are recognised world-wide.**

Our CCA programme also includes other learning opportunities, such as Values in Action (VIA) projects, learning journeys and Education and Career Guidance (ECG) talks.

Expectations of CCA

No prior skills and knowledge are required. SJB cadets are expected to be well with no serious medical conditions (due to some training being physically demanding), disciplined, committed and responsible.
