2 <u>School Timetable Matters</u>

2.1 School Timetable

The 2024 timetable is available for downloading via the school website. The link is here: <u>https://www.meridiansec.moe.edu.sg/student-information/student-timetable/</u>.

Students are to report in their respective classrooms by 7.30 am every morning. Dismissal timings are indicated in the school timetable.

Students may have remedial and enrichment lessons, and CCAs scheduled after dismissal. To nurture students who are self-directed, identified groups of students would



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attend remedial after school, while the other students would have the opportunity to seek clarifications with the teacher either virtually through online platforms and in asynchronous mode after lessons.

For school activities carried out after dismissal, subject teachers and staff-in-charge of programmes and CCA will provide more information via Parents Gateway.

2.2 Independent Learning Days (ILD)

2.2.1 Blended Learning

Blended Learning is a learning experience that encompasses face-to-face learning in school and independent learning at home, to develop independent, passionate, intrinsically motivated, and self-directed learners. Independent Learning Days (ILD) will be on even week Fridays and will allow students to manage their own learning and explore and pursue their interests from home. There will be a total of 8 ILDs in Semester 1. The schedule of subjects and activities on each ILD can be found in the link for the school timetable given above.

2.2.2 Activities during the ILD

Each ILD will comprise <u>curriculum tasks</u> and <u>student-initiated learning</u> (SIL). SIL encourages learning beyond the formal curriculum, and students are encouraged to explore their interests and passions as part of the ILD. Students' check-in with the FTs at 7.30 am and should complete their curriculum tasks by the end of the ILD. The estimated timings serve as a guide for students to allocate their time appropriately. Details of the curriculum tasks will be provided by subject teachers and will be updated on the ILD Google Doc latest by 5 pm on the Thursday before the ILD.

2.2.3 Parents' consent for proposed SIL

We seek parents'/guardians' support in the students' SIL. Students are expected to show their parents/guardians the proposal before starting the activity. The school would require parents/guardians to give consent for the student's chosen SIL in an upcoming message sent through Parent Gateway. 2.3 Student Attire

Students are to wear the prescribed school uniform whenever they come to school, including during the term and semester breaks. Examples of the prescribed school uniform are (a) shirt and bottoms, (b) Polo T-shirt and bottoms and (c) CCA shirt/Class T-shirt and bottoms.



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Students are allowed to wear approved PE attire for PE lessons and during sports and games. Students may report to school in PE attire from the start of the day if they have PE lessons for the day.

On days when students have CCA, they are allowed to wear their CCA attire. On Fridays, students are allowed to wear their class T-shirts, if any.

For Sec 1 students who have just joined the school, they are allowed to wear their primary school uniforms until they get their uniform.

2.4 School policy on use of mobile phones and possession of other expensive items

To provide a conducive learning environment for the students, we strongly discourage students from bringing electronic devices, smart watches or other expensive items to school. In particular, handphones are a great source of distraction for students in the classrooms.

- All handphones and/or communication devices should be turned off (not just put on silent mode) and locked away in the lockers designated to each classroom before the start of the first lesson.
- Handphones are banned for students' use from 7.30 am till the end of curriculum time every school day. Any handphone **or** communication device found with a student during such hours will be confiscated, up to a term. The SIM card will be returned to the students.
- At the end of the school day, students will retrieve their handphones and/or communication from the lockers. Students must ensure their handphones and/or communication are kept on silent mode as long as they are in school.
- Personal learning devices (e.g Chromebooks) may only be used for learning purposes in the classrooms under the instruction of teachers during curriculum time.

For emergencies, parents/guardians are advised to call the school General Office at 65831387. Please provide the name and class of the student so that we can act on the



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information. For non-emergency cases, please leave a message to their child/ward's mobile phone for them to call after school dismissal.

In the event of loss of electronic devices or other expensive items due to students' negligence, the school will not be held responsible.

3 <u>Secondary 1 Matters</u>

3.1 Secondary 1 Orientation

We congratulate our Sec 1 students on completing their primary school education and making the choice to be part of our Meridian team.

On the first day of school, **2 Jan (Tue)**, students will report by 7.30 am. There will be four days of orientation and dismissal will be at 1.25 pm from 2 Jan (Tue) to 4 Jan (Thu) and 6.30 pm on 5 Jan (Fri).

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3.3 Sec 1 CCA Orientation

Sec 1 students will go through the CCA Orientation on 5 Jan (Fri) from 2.30 to 4.00pm in school. Students will use this platform to shortlist 4 CCAs in which they intend to have indepth hands-on sessions during the 2 weeks of CCA Experience in the middle of January. By the end of the month, all Sec 1 students will make their final choices of their preferred CCAs in ranked order. CCA allocations are done based on interests, suitability and attitude, among other things.

Sports CCA trials will be conducted for those interested students. More details to be shared in due course. Students admitted to Meridian via DSA will commence their CCA sessions in Week 2.

4 Sec 2 to 5 Matters

4.1 Welcome Back to School

School will reopen on **2 Jan (Tue)** for the new academic year, with **1 Jan (Mon)** being a school holiday. All students will report by 7.30 am. Sec 1 students will report at their respective classrooms, while Sec 2 - 5 students will report at the hall. There will be level-curated programmes for checking-in of wellbeing, class bonding and reminders on expectation and shared values. The dismissal time for Sec 2 - 5 will be at 12.30 pm.

Normal curriculum for Sec 2 – 5 will resume on **3 Jan (Wed)** onwards.

4.2 Open Houses – Post-Secondary Educational Institutions

Students, especially the Sec 4 and 5 students, are strongly encouraged to independently attend the Open Houses organised by various post-secondary educational institutions. Participating in the Open Houses will provide students with valuable insights into the educational environment, allowing them to explore the diverse range of courses offered by these institutions, attend informative talks and interact with the school personnel and students.

Polytechnic Open Houses are held on **4 – 6 Jan (Thu – Sat).** In addition, some polytechnics offer a Parents' Seminar during these dates, providing parents with the opportunity to learn more about the courses and programmes available and offer guidance to their child accordingly. 7.1 Verification of Student Details Report

Please assist to verify the information of your child/ward's Student Details Report at the beginning of the year. Your submission should be made via PG (Parents Gateway) app by 16 Jan (Mon). If there are any changes (medical, contact info) to be made after the submission, please approach the Form Teacher for assistance. Do note that this updated information is important for the school.

7.2 NRIC Registration for 15 Years Old

Under the National Registration Regulations, all Singapore Citizens and Permanent Residents are required to register for their NRIC in the year that the child attains the age of 15 years. To provide greater convenience to our students, this registration exercise will be conducted in our school in March 2024. Immigration and Checkpoints Authority (ICA)



will send a Notification for Registration of NRIC to all parents whose children are due for registration two weeks before the visit by the ICA mobile team.

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8 Road Safety

For the safety of our students and other road users, we would like to remind parents/guardians who drive the students to school not to stop their vehicles directly in front of the school gates or too close to the traffic light. Please follow the directions given by the security guards/staff and do slow down your vehicle within school compounds. In light of ongoing roadworks around the vicinity of the school and Pasir Ris, we urge all students and parents / guardians / visitors to school to take extra precautions when using the pedestrian crossings and walkways.

9 <u>Health Matters</u>

9.1 HPV Vaccinations for Girls

The HPV vaccine helps to protect females against cervical cancer, which is caused by HPV infection. HPV vaccination is now offered as a school-based programme for our female students and is free of charge. Consent from parents is required for this vaccination. All Sec 1, 2, 3 and 4 female students will receive this vaccination nearer to the vaccination date.

9.2 Annual Health Screening

The annual health screening, conducted by Health Promotion Board, will be held at the school for all students. More information will be given nearer to the date.
