# DRESS CODE FOR GIRLS

- Must be modest, traditional / ethnic clothing
- Skirts/dresses to be at least knee-length
- Must come in **black school shoes**



# DRESS CODE FOR GIRLS

- **Non-ethnic attire not allowed.**  
(modern dresses/ t-shirt/ jersey and jeans)
- **No revealing / see-through outfits**  
(no cropped top, no sleeveless)
- **No accessories and headwear** such as jewellery, hats and hijab



# DRESS CODE FOR BOYS

- **Must** be modest, traditional / ethnic clothing
- Must come in **black school shoes**



# DRESS CODE FOR BOYS

- **Non-ethnic attire not allowed.**  
(business suit or t-shirt/ jersey and jeans)
- **No accessories and headwear** such as turbans, songkok and jewellery



# FAQS

## Is it compulsory to wear traditional clothes for RHD?

- Students who do not wish to wear traditional clothes have the choice to wear their usual school attire (i.e. polo tee with uniform bottoms) to school.
- Students are not allowed to wear CCA tee or Class tee.
- Students are encouraged to borrow traditional clothes from friends.



# FAQS

**I have PE lesson on Wednesday. What should I do?**

- Bring PE attire to school. You cannot attend PE in your traditional clothes.

**I do not wish to wear my traditional clothes throughout the school day. What should I do?**

- Change into your traditional clothes during recess and/or before CCE lesson .
